**SOCIAL DISTANCING FOR
YOUNG CHILDREN**

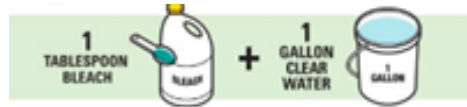
- Keep children in smaller groups and do not mix groups of children- the same kids each day throughout the day
- Implement staggered outdoor play times to limit the number of children who are together at one time
- Have check-in outside permitting weather
- Limit the amount of items coming in and out of the center

**WHEN TO WASH YOUR AND
CHILD'S HANDS**

- TOILETING, DIAPERING OR ASSISTING TOILET
- NOSE BLOWING OR WIPING ANOTHERS NOSE
- HANDLING RAW FOOD
- TAKING OFF GLOVES
- OUTDOOR PLAY
- SMOKING
- HANDLING ANIMALS
- PREPARING SERVING OR EATING FOOD
- PUTTING ON GLOVES

**ROUTINE ENVIRONMENTAL
CLEANING**

- Clean toys, commonly shared items, and touched surfaces like handrails and doorknobs at least daily and when visibly soiled.
- Set aside toys children have placed in their mouths or otherwise contaminated with bodily fluids, until they have been cleaned and sanitized.



Clean and sanitize hard surfaces and non-absorbent toys with the 3 step method!

- Wash with soapy water
- Rinse with clear water and wipe dry with paper towels
- Sanitize with chlorine bleach solution

Allow everything to AIR DRY!

CONDUCT DAILY HEALTH CHECKS OF CHILDREN AND STAFF

- Check temperatures and send children home if they have a temperature of 100 degrees F or above.
- Ask parents at arrival if the child or anyone in the home has signs of respiratory illness (fever, cough, shortness of breath).
- Ask staff to self-screen by checking themselves for a fever (100.4 degrees F or above) or symptoms of respiratory illness before they interact with children.

ENCOURAGE PARENTS TO HAVE A PLAN IN THE EVENT OF THEIR CHILD BEING SICK

- Ensure sick children are isolated and supervised until their parents can pick them up.

As a reminder, continue to follow child care licensing standards and typical quality care practices through this time of crisis.
